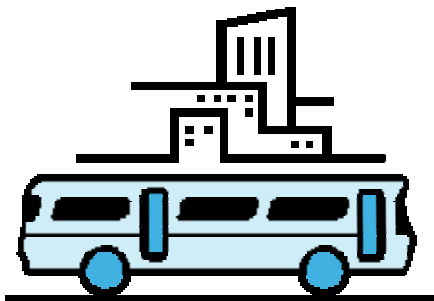

How We Get There

Ensure Equity: Distribute burdens and benefits fairly — provide equitable access to transportation choices

Ensure Fiscal Stewardship: Prioritize investments that achieve multiple goals, giving taxpayer and passengers more for their money

Deliver Accountability: Promote public and private collaboration with meaningful community participation, and transportation agencies that take responsibility for their actions



Discussion Topics at the Workshops

1. **Protecting and Enhancing Regional Mobility:** Our region is striving to keep pace with growth in mobility corridors leading to traffic congestion. Targeting improvements to the most critical bottlenecks, enhancing transportation options other than single-occupancy-cars, grouping destinations to reduce trips and supporting transit are some of the solutions to improve the region's mobility issues.



2. **Building Sustainable Livable Communities:** A livable community has safe streets, accessible transportation options, good schools, public/private spaces and strong accessible centers that help foster a spirit of community. Attendees will participate in discussions on how to make their community more vibrant to live and attractive for new businesses.



3. **Enhancing Safety and Security:** Upgrading our transportation system with new technologies and informational tools to make our communities safer and secure is one of the priorities in the Old Colony Planning Council region. Supporting strategies for mitigating natural disasters, identifying emergencies evacuation methods as well as methods to reduce the number of crashes in the region will be the focus of this workshop.

4. **Environmental Protection and Climate Change:** Reducing pollution, restoring and protecting the natural environment and animal habitat by promoting alternative methods of transportation such as bicycle and transit, encouraging the use of clean alternative fuels, use of recyclable materials for new transportation infrastructure and the use of preventative methods to lesser natural disasters caused by the effects of climate change.
