

Conservation Land Review Committee  
May 21, 2008

The meeting was called to order when a Quorum was reached at 7:20 p.m.

The Cranberry Watershed Management Plan is nearly complete. Attached will be:  
A map of the Bay Circuit Trail,  
Parking area – just the access off Grove Street  
Municipal properties that serve as buffer zone  
Priority habitat – Bog 8 – 9  
Pine Brook Restoration Project

The final version and the addenda will be given to Conservation Commission to sign off and then sent to the DCR.

Sandy MacFarlane will be the representative to the committee from the Board of Selectmen.

The next priority will be Camp Nekon. A site visit is planned for June 22 at 9:30. Meet the top of Monk's Hill Road.

The need for maintenance for the Silver Lake Sanctuary was discussed.

The theft of aluminum pipe and other materials from Cranberry Watershed was discussed. Gary will ask Paul Basler to remove the rest of the pipes and other salvage material before more is stolen.

The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 25 at 7:30

Pine duBois left the meeting at 7:40; Mark Guidoboni arrived – keeping the quorum.

Mark recommended that a representative from the Recreation Commission attend the meeting on June 25 as a non-voting member since Camp Nekon is used by both Conservation and Recreation.

There was discussion about the potential uses of Smelt Pond for boating, fishing and other recreational activities that are currently taking place on Kingston Bay.

The Meeting adjourned at 8:05 p.m.
