The meeting was called to order by the Chairman at 7:30 p.m.

On a motion by David Pepe, seconded by Walter Hoeg, the minutes of May 17<sup>th</sup> were approved with corrections. Vote 3 yes, 1 abstention (Correction - Maple Ave School is not significant for economic history of Kingston)

On a motion by David Pepe, seconded by Walter Hoeg the minutes of May 24, 2011 were approved with corrections. (Correction- typo change maple to Maple) Vote: unanimous

On a motion by David Pepe, seconded by Walter Hoeg, the minutes of June 6, 2011 were approved as written. Vote was unanimous.

**Correspondence:**

- The chairman received a letter from the Town Accountant on fixed assets
- The Commission has \$282.00 in the account. The Chairman will order the materials needed by the Commission (postage, folders and historic resource books) and submit the bill to the Town Accountant.

**New Business:**

- The owner of 262 Main Street wants to remove the back of the house. He will apply for a demo permit and attend our next meeting.
- On a motion by Frances Hoeg, seconded by Walter Hoeg, the Commission voted unanimously to elect Craig Dalton as the Commission's representative to the CPC. The Secretary will send a letter to the Selectmen and to the Chairman of the CPC notifying them of this vote. A copy will be sent to the Town Clerk.

**Elm Street Bridge:**

A demolition permit has been received (June 3, 2011) for the Elm Street Bridge. Rivets and trusses are to be dark brown like the railings. Railings and sidewalks are higher than the trusses. The Commission will request that they be the same height.

The Commission reviewed the Historical Significance of the Bridge and on a motion by David Pepe, seconded by Walter Hoeg, voted unanimously that "the bridge is part of the character of the area and meets the criteria for being Historically Significant, but due to its deterioration it is not subject to a demolition delay and can be removed.

**Maple Avenue School:**

The complete bill for the structural assessment has not been received and will be forthcoming.

On a motion by David Pepe, seconded by Walter Hoeg, the Commission voted unanimously to adjourn at 8:30 pm.
