

Minutes

The **meeting was called to order** by Chairman Craig Dalton at 7:40 p.m.

Minutes were not reviewed.

Commission members reviewed a letter by the Chairman to the DOT regarding the Elm Street Bridge. Commission members discussed and agreed with the content of the letter.

A Hearing on the property at 101 Indian Pond Road was convened at 8:00 p.m. After discussion on the property owned by Mr. Black, it was **moved by Robert Murphy, seconded by David Pepe** to allow alterations to 101 Indian Pond Road as submitted by Mr. Black, and to not preferably preserve the property. The **motion carried on a unanimous vote** of the Commission.

On a **motion by Robert Murphy, seconded by David Pepe**, the Hearing on 101 Indian Pond Road was closed at 8:15 p.m. The **vote was unanimous**.

Paul Armstrong met with the Commission to discuss the burned barn on Summer and Cross Streets. At this point no decision has been made regarding demolition, which might be required if the barn is condemned. The Commission will be kept apprised of the situation.

Other Business:

Demo 10-02 Pembroke Street- Information received regarding this demolition is at this point incomplete. Additional information will be provided to the Commission prior to any action taking place.

The Commission discussed the need for a web site manager. No action was taken at this time.

The Commission discussed the status of the Powder House. No action was taken.

The **meeting adjourned at 9:10 p.m. on a motion by Robert Murphy seconded by David Pepe**. The vote to adjourn was unanimous.
