MINUTES  
April 3, 2007

Chairman Joseph D. Kelleher opened the meeting of the Board of Selectmen held on April 3, 2007 at 7:00 p.m. in Room 200 at the Town House, 26 Evergreen Street, Kingston. Present were Vice Chairman Mark S. Beaton, Paul M. Gallagher, Sandra D. MacFarlane, Jean M. Landis-Naumann and Town Administrator Kevin R. Donovan.

The Chairman announced the dates to note.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 4 to 0 to 1 vote, it was –

VOTED: To approve the minutes of the March 27, 2007 public session meeting.

Ms. MacFarlane abstained from voting because she was not present at the March 27, 2007 meeting.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 4 to 1 vote, it was –

VOTED: To endorse and send the Smart Growth infrastructure approval letter to DHCD.

Mr. Kelleher did not support the motion.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 5 to 0 to 0 vote, it was –

VOTED: To renew Junk Dealers License for Langenbach's Fine Art & Antiques, Olden Days Shop, and Re-Creations Consignment and to renew Bowling Alley Licenses for the following; Alley Kat Lanes and Kingston Ten Pin; and to renew Billiards and Pool Table Licenses for the American Legion, Hillside Social Club and Hilltop Athletic Club, and further;

VOTED: To renew the Commercial Mussel Licenses for Brian Holmes, Thomas Taylor, John Wheble, and Matthew Wheble.

Mrs. Landis-Naumann left the meeting at 7:03 p.m.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 4 to 0 to 0 vote, it was –

VOTED: To appoint Debra J. Mueller as Animal Control Officer, Kelly A. Cram as Assistant Animal Control Officer, James C. Judge to the Industrial Development Finance Authority, James Matatal as Register of Voters and William B. Martin as Veterans' Agent, Veterans Burial Agent, Veterans' Graves Officer and Director of Veterans' Services.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 5 to 0 to 0 vote, it was –

VOTED: To accept the donations for the Council on Aging Building Fund; Kingston Kids Care - \$4,322.98; Virginia Kandola - \$25.00; and Philip and Mary O'Connell - \$10.00.

Mr. Gallagher noted the donation of Kingston Kids Care and offered his appreciation for their continued support of the Seniors.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 5 to 0 to 0 vote, it was –

VOTED: To approve the payment of \$1,716.66 for Special Counsel and \$1,710.00 for a Soil Scientist from the Wetland Protection Fund.

The Board reviewed the Articles for the Special and Annual Town Meeting and voted its recommendations on the Articles as indicated on the attached list. (website viewers; Article listing is in a separate document which can be accessed through link on Minutes listing entitled "08 Recommendations")

The Board reviewed the dates for the continuation of the Town Meeting and whether to recommend Tuesday and Wednesday. Moderator Frances Hoeg came forward and advised that it was up to the Town Meeting body to determine the dates for continuance. Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 4 to 0 to 0 vote, it was –

VOTED: To recommend adjourning the Annual Town Meeting to Tuesday and Wednesday if necessary.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 4 to 0 to 0 vote, it was –

VOTED: To cancel the Board's regularly scheduled meeting for April 10, 2007.

Upon motion made and seconded, following a discussion and a 5 to 0 to 0 vote, it was –

VOTED: To enter into executive session<sup>1</sup> for the purpose of discussing Financial Assistance requests and the disposition of real property.
